CHAP. 162 have in possession, at any time, any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Section 2. Whoever violates any provisions of section one of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of said section.

Chapter 162.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in the Tributaries to Upper and Lower Wilson Ponds, in the County of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fishing prohibited in waters herein named.

—proviso.

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish, at any time, in any of the tributaries to Upper Wilson pond or in any of the tributaries to Lower Wilson pond, in the county of Piscataquis; provided, further, that the stream connecting said ponds shall be construed to be a tributary to Lower Wilson pond down as far as low water mark in said Lower Wilson pond at the mouth of said stream. No person shall have in possession, at any time, any kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this act. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Chapter 163.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Overset Pond, in the Town of Greenwood, in Oxford County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trout and landlocked salmon fishing regulated in Overset pond.

—penalty for violation.

No person shall take, catch or kill more than five trout and landlocked salmon in all in any one day in Overset pond, in the town of Greenwood, in Oxford county, nor shall any person have in possession in any one day more than five trout and landlocked salmon in all taken in said pond. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten

dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act. CHAP. 164

Chapter 164.

An Act to Repeal Section Forty-five of Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to the Jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-five of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, is hereby repealed. —repealed.

Chapter 165.

An Act to Amend Subdivision "Third" of Section Twenty-three of Chapter Forty-eight of the Revised Statutes, Permitting Savings Banks and Institutions for Savings to Invest Their Deposits in the First Mortgage Bonds of Certain Bridge Companies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Subdivision "third," section twenty-three of chapter forty-eight of the Revised Statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto, under the designation of clause 'h' the following: Ch. 48, Sec. 23, R. S., amended.

'h. In the first mortgage bonds of any bridge company owning a railroad bridge, located wholly or partly in the State of Maine, provided payment of said bonds as to principal and interest is guaranteed by a railroad company organized under the laws of the State and owning and operating a railroad in this State.'

First mortgage bonds permitted.
