any person have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken on or through the ice in said pond. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed, or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act. ### Chapter 211.

An Act Additional to Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Fishing in Berry Pond and Its Tributaries, in the Towns of Winthrop and Wayne, in the County of Kennebec.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time on or through the ice in Berry pond, situated in the town of Winthrop and in the town of Wayne, in the county of Kennebec; nor shall any person fish for, take, catch, or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to said pond; nor shall any person have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in any of said tributaries or through the ice in said pond. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall pay a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs of prosecution for each offense; and in addition thereto one dollar for each fish taken, killed or had in possession in violation of any provision of this act. ### Chapter 212.

An Act to Amend Section Two of Chapter Thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter Two Hundred Six of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Thirteen, Relating to Ice Fishing in Sand Pond, in Denmark, in the County of Oxford.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

So much of section two of chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred six of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred thirteen, as prohibits fishing through the ice, in accordance with the general law of the State relating to ice fishing, in Sand pond, in Denmark, in the county of Oxford, is hereby repealed. Ice fishing
