Chapter 82.

CHAP. 82

An Act to Change the Name of The Board of Trade of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred thirty-two of the Private and Special Laws of the year one thousand eight hundred fifty-four is hereby amended so that The Board of Trade of Portland shall be known as and have the name of The Chamber of Commerce of Portland, Maine, and all changes in said chapter two hundred thirty-two necessary to give full effect to such amendment are hereby made.

Chapter 83.

An Act to Ratify, Confirm and Make Valid the Proceedings of the First Congregational Parish of Kittery.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All of the proceedings of the First Congregational Parish of Kittery, a parish duly incorporated under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Section 2. The said First Congregational Parish of Kittery is empowered and authorized to unite with the Congregational church of said Kittery as a duly incorporated body under the title of the Kittery Point Congregational Church whenever, at a duly called meeting of the said parish, two-thirds of the members, present and voting, shall declare themselves in favor of such union.

Chapter 84.

An Act to Amend Section One of Chapter Three Hundred Eighty of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nine, Relating to the Taking of Lobsters and the Setting of Lobster Traps in the Waters of Gouldsboro, Eden, Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Sullivan and Sorrento.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred eighty of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred nine is hereby amended by inserting after the word "and" in the fourth line thereof the words, 'no person shall set any lobster trap under a penalty of,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:
