Chapter 151.

CHAP. 151

An Act to Repeal Chapter Eighty-seven of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred Three, Relating to the Taking of Lobsters within Three Miles of the Islands of Matinicus and Criehaven.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The provisions of chapter eighty-seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred three, entitled, "An Act Relating to the Taking of Lobsters within Three Miles of the Islands of Matinicus and Criehaven, During the Months of August and September, in Each Year," are hereby repealed.

Chapter 152.

An Act Permitting the Use of Automobiles in the Town of Mount Desert.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

All acts and parts thereof, prohibiting or restricting the use of automobiles or motor vehicles in the town of Mount Desert, on the island of Mount Desert, in the county of Hancock, are hereby repealed. All by-laws and ordinances of said town of Mount Desert, prohibiting or restricting the use of automobiles or motor vehicles on the town ways, streets or highways of said town, are hereby declared void and of no effect.

—Automobiles admitted to town of Mount Desert.

Chapter 153.

An Act to Restore the Jurisdiction in Criminal Offenses to Trial Justices in the Towns of Kittery and York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trial justices in the towns of Kittery and York, in the county of York, shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the Yorkshire municipal court of all criminal offenses including all violations of town by-laws, in said towns.
