Chapter 55.

Resolve Providing a State Pension for Sarah A. Robinson.

Sarah A. Robinson, state pension for. Resolved, That the sum of twelve dollars per month be paid to Sarah A. Robinson of Mt. Vernon, widow of Freeman W. Robinson, a veteran of the Civil war, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, beginning January first, nineteen hundred fifteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature, and until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 56.

Resolve in Favor of Frank P. Washburn, Secretary of the Committee on Indian Affairs, to Defray Expenses of said Committee in Visiting the Reservations at Pleasant Point and Old Town.

Frank P. Washburn, in favor of. Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Frank P. Washburn, secretary of the committee on Indian Affairs in the Seventy-seventh Legislature, the sum of two hundred one dollars and thirteen cents; said sum being the amount of expenses incurred by said committee in visiting the Indian reservations at Pleasant Point and Old Town.

Chapter 57.

Resolve in Favor of the Assistant Folder and Page of the Seventy-sixth Legislature for Attendance at the Organization of the Seventy-seventh Legislature.

Assistant folder and page, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to each of the following officers for attendance at the organization of the Seventy-seventh Legislature, the amounts set against their respective names, amounting to the sum of thirty-two dollars.

Claude Willis Townsend, Jr., Assistant Folder, services, fifteen dollars; mileage one dollar, total, sixteen dollars.

John F. Locke, Senate Page, services, fifteen dollars; mileage one dollar, total, sixteen dollars; making a total of thirty-two dollars.
