CHAP. 254

Chapter 254.

Resolve Providing for the Purchase of a Certain Portrait of Major General Joshua L. Chamberlain, a Former Governor of This State.

Joshua L. Chamberlain, in favor of purchase of portrait of.

Resolved, That a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated to be used in purchasing the portrait painted by Joseph B. Kahill, of Portland, of Major General Joshua L. Chamberlain, late of Brunswick, a former Governor of this State, and one of Maine's distinguished sons; the said portrait to be placed, under the direction of the Governor and Council, in some suitable place in the State House.

Chapter 255.

Resolve Authorizing the State Treasurer and the State Auditor to Adjust Certain Accounts in the State Treasurer's Office.

State Treasurer and State Auditor authorized to adjust certain accounts in State Treasurer's office.

Resolved, That the State Treasurer and the State Auditor are hereby authorized to make the necessary entries to place at their true standing the sums now to the credit and also the sums now charged against certain plantations and townships of the State, in accordance with the recommendations of said Treasurer and Auditor, made in pursuance of chapter two hundred ninety-seven, of the Resolves of nineteen hundred thirteen, and as contained in their report to the present Legislature of their action under said Resolve.

Chapter 256.

Resolve in Favor of Mrs. Blanche M. Reynolds, Edward J. McWiggin, Thomas Hawkins and William H. Hawkins.

Heirs of Thomas McWiggin, in favor of.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of three thousand four hundred sixty-six dollars and nineteen cents, the same being amount of money paid by the public administrator into the Treasury of the State from the estate of Thomas McWiggin, late of Lewiston, deceased; and that this amount be appropriated and paid as follows: Two thousand four hundred sixty-six dollars and nineteen cents to Mrs. Blanche M. Reynolds; five hundred dollars to Edward J. McWiggin; two hundred fifty dollars to Thomas Hawkins; and two hundred fifty dollars to William H. Hawkins.
