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**CHAP. 301****Chapter 301.**

Resolve to Reimburse the Town of Aurora for Over-expenditure on the Nineteen Hundred Thirteen State Aid Road.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of eighty-six dollars to reimburse the town of Aurora for over-expenditure in connection with state aid work done in nineteen hundred thirteen.

**Chapter 302.**

Resolve in Favor of Rena Cooley of Augusta.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of two hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred fifteen and the sum of two hundred dollars for the year nineteen hundred sixteen, to be paid, in quarterly payments of fifty dollars each, during each said year, to Rena Cooley of Augusta, for and in behalf of herself and her minor children, Violet and Evelyn; under the supervision of the Governor and Council.

**Chapter 303.**

Resolve in Favor of Gorham P. Grant for Refund of Money Paid in Lieu of Military Service in the Late War of the Rebellion.

Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars to be paid to Gorham P. Grant of Winterport to reimburse him for money expended in August, eighteen hundred sixty-three, in lieu of draft for military service in the late war of the Rebellion.

**Chapter 304.**

Resolve Providing a State Pension for Mary A. Moulton.

Resolved, That there be paid to Mary A. Moulton of Cushing the sum of eight dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions, beginning January first, nineteen hundred fifteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature.
