Chapter 358.

Resolve in Favor of P. H. Fitzgerald for Services as Mail Carrier to the House of Representatives.

P. H. Fitzgerald, in favor of. Resolved, That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of one hundred fifty dollars, to be paid to P. H. Fitzgerald for services as mail carrier to the House of Representatives during the session of the Seventy-seventh Legislature.

Chapter 359.

Resolve in Favor of Gardner K. Heath for Services in Preparing a Schedule of All Acts and Resolves Carrying an Appropriation or Expenditure of Money.

Gardner K. Heath, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of one hundred thirty-five dollars be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Gardner K. Heath for services performed in preparing the schedule of all Acts and Resolves carrying an appropriation or expenditure of money, which had been signed by the Governor, which had been reported by the committees and had not been finally passed, and which were still pending before the committees up to March fifteenth.
