keep a record of his doings and furnish a copy to any interested person requiring and paying for it.'

'Sec. 18. R. S., c. 139, § 8, 9 and 11 applicable. The provisions of sections eight, nine and eleven of chapter one hundred thirty-nine of the revised statutes are hereby extended to and made applicable to the case of any woman committed from the reformatory for women in the foregoing manner, except that said fees and costs shall be audited and allowed by the state auditor and shall be paid by the state.'

#### Chapter 89.

An Act to Refund a Certain Bond Issued in Favor of the Trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

State treasurer to refund bond formerly issued to Trustees of Maine For the purpose of refunding and paying an un-Insane Hospital. negotiable registered bond of the State of Maine for the sum of fifty thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, issued to the Trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital, as provided in chapter seventy of the resolves of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, the treasurer of the state be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue to the hospital trustees for the benefit of the Augusta State Hospital, formerly the Maine Insane Hospital, an unnegotiable registered bond, for the sum of fifty thousand dollars, bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first days of January and July of each year, at the treasurer's office; said bond shall be payable in thirty years from the first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred seventeen, and shall be signed by the treasurer, countersigned by the governor, and attested by the state auditor; and the state treasurer and his successors in office shall pay to the treasurer of said hospital, the interest on said bond until its maturity.

#### Chapter 90.

An Act to Amend Section Thirty-four of Chapter One Hundred Forty-five of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Temporary Leave of Absence of Patients from Insane Hospitals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 145, § 34, relating to inmates of institutions for the insane leaving temporarily. Section thirty-four of chapter one hundred forty-five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the words: 'The superintendent of either hospital with the approval of the board of trustees may on receipt of formal application in writing before the date
