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Provided, that any balance of the sums above appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen which may remain unexpended at the end of the year shall be available for expenditure during the year nineteen hundred and twenty, and provided, further, that the governor and council, may, by order, upon recommendation of the trustees of the said institution, authorize the use of unexpended balances of any of the above appropriations to meet deficiencies in other appropriations for the same institution.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary S. Hillman, of Island Falls, for State Pension.

Mary S. Hillman of Island Falls, state pension. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of three hundred dollars per annum for the years nineteen hundred and nineteen and nineteen hundred and twenty; the said money to be paid Mary S. Hillman, of Island Falls, in quarterly payments of seventy-five dollars each.
