Chapter 70.

Resolve, Providing for the Payment of Certain Deficiencies that Accrued Prior to January First, Nineteen Hundred and Eighteen.

Deficiencies not properly payable from contingent fund, authorizing payment of. Resolved: That for the purpose of paying the several claims, accounts and demands against the state that accrued prior to, and remaining unpaid on January first, nineteen hundred and eighteen, and which were not properly payable from the state contingent fund, that there be appropriated the sum of three thousand seven hundred dollars and fortyfive cents for the following purposes:

Chapter 71.

Resolve, in Favor of Mary F. Fernald, for Military Pension.

Mary F. Fernald of Kennebunk, state pension. Resolved: That there be paid to Mary F. Fernald of Kennebunk, a pension of six dollars per month, payable quarterly, from the fund appropriated for military pen-

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sions, beginning January first, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature or until otherwise ordered.

Chapter 72.

Resolve, in Favor of Alfred D. Sawyer, to Reimburse him for Expenses Incurred as Secretary of the Committee on State School for Boys.

Alfred D. Sawyer, secretary legislative committee State School for Boys, expenses. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of sixty-seven dollars and twenty cents to be paid to A. D. Sawyer, secretary of the committee on State School for Boys, State School for Girls and Woman's Reformatory for expenses incurred in visiting the State School for Boys at Portland and the Woman's Reformatory at Skowhegan.

Chapter 73.

Resolve, in Favor of the Augusta State Hospital for Maintenance and other Purposes for the Years Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen and Nineteen Hundred and Twenty.

Augusta State Hospital, maintenance. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated for the Augusta State Hospital:

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For personal services, namely, for salaries and wages of all officers and employees except those wholly engaged in repairs of buildings and equipment, for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, the sum of one hundred and nine thousand dollars, and for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, the sum of one hundred and nine thousand dollars,

- For food supplies, namely, all articles of food, for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen, the sum of one hundred and five thousand dollars, and for the year nineteen hundred and twenty, the sum of one hundred and five thousand dollars,
- For clothing, namely, all articles of personal clothing and materials for making the same, for the year nineteen hundred and nineteen,

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
