Chapter 99.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Howland.

Howland, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Howland, for reimbursement for money expended in replanking the highway bridge between Howland and West Enfield, the sum of nine hundred dollars, the appropriation to be paid from the bridge maintenance fund.

Chapter 100.

Resolve, in Favor of Lena F. Cummings, Widow of Henry F. Cummings.

Lena F. Cummings, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and is hereby, appropriated the sum of nineteen hundred and sixty-one dollars and eighty-five cents, to reimburse Lena F. Cummings of Manchester, Maine, for money expended and expenses required, in defending a petition for removal, before the governor and council, brought against Henry F. Cummings as sheriff of Kennebec county, late of said Manchester, her husband.

Chapter 101.

Resolve, in Favor of the Town of Alfred, for Reimbursement.

Alfred, town of, payment of claim. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is appropriated to be paid to the town of Alfred, for reimbursement for amount expended for the reconstruction of five bridges, the sum of three thousand, seven hundred eighty-eight dollars and eight cents, and that the same be paid from the bridge maintenance fund.

Chapter 102.

Resolve, in Favor of the Towns of Gardiner and Randolph.

Gardiner and Randolph, towns of, appropriation for repair of drawbridge. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid to the towns of Gardiner and Randolph, to aid in the repair and maintenance of the drawbridge between the two towns, the sum of one thousand dollars to be used for the maintenance of said drawbridge and twenty-five hundred dollars to be used for painting same, for the fiscal year nine-
