may take and hold property and receive income, for the purposes for which it was incorporated, to any amount.

**Sec. 2. Qualifications of trustees changed.** All provisions of law prohibiting any one, who is not a native born citizen, from ever being a trustee or holding any office in said corporation are hereby repealed.

## Chapter 20.

**AN ACT Authorizing the Payment of an Annuity by the City of Portland to Rosa B. Reidy.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**Rosa B. Reidy; annuity authorized.** The city council of the city of Portland may annually hereafter appropriate and pay to Rosa B. Reidy, widow of James H. Reidy, a former member of the police department of said city, who died on the tenth of November, nineteen hundred twenty-eight, by reason of injuries received while in the discharge of his official duties, a sum not exceeding twenty-five dollars per month for the benefit of herself. Said annuity may be granted to said Rosa B. Reidy during her widowhood.

## Chapter 21.

**AN ACT to Provide a Better Government for the Town of Bar Harbor.**

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

**P. & S. L., 1927, c. 10, sec. 12; relating to a better government for the town of Bar Harbor, amended.** Private and special laws nineteen hundred twenty-seven, chapter ten, section twelve, is hereby amended by striking out the words "not to exceed four thousand dollars per year" in the second line thereof and inserting the words 'not to exceed six thousand dollars per year' in the place thereof, so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

**'Sec. 12. Salary not to exceed six thousand dollars.** The town manager shall devote his entire time to his said office, and shall receive for his services a sum not to exceed six thousand dollars per year, and actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his duties, to be paid by the town treasurer in monthly payments on the first day of every month.'
