Stubbs, at two dollars and twenty-five cents per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian; and that there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of five hundred dollars.

Chapter 61.

RESOLVE, for the Purchase of the History of York, Maine.

"History of York, Maine," purchase of copies. Resolved: That the state librarian be authorized to purchase twenty-five copies of the History of York, Maine, by Charles Edward Banks, at a price not exceeding twenty-five dollars per copy (three volumes), said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the said librarian; and there be and hereby is appropriated for this purpose the sum of five hundred dollars.

Chapter 62.

RESOLVE, for the Purchase of One Hundred Copies of the "History of the Town of Cushing."

"History of the Town of Cushing," purchase of copies. Resolved: That the state purchase fifty copies of the "History of the Town of Cushing," by the late Judge Frank B. Miller, at a price not exceeding eight dollars per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian, and that there be and is appropriated for this purpose the sum of four hundred dollars.

Approved April 2, 1931.

Chapter 63.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Harry C. Aldrich.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be paid to Harry C. Aldrich, commorant of Cutler, the sum of two hundred dollars to reimburse him for the damages caused to his automobile by a moose near Skowhegan during August, nineteen hundred twenty-nine, from the funds of the fish and game department.
