Chapter 73.

RESOLVE, to Repeal a Resolve Providing for a State Pension for Charles Brown.

Pension for Charles Brown, discontinued. Resolved: That chapter 105 of the resolves of 1929, providing for a state pension for Charles Brown, be, and hereby is, repealed.

Approved March 20, 1933

Chapter 74.

RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing in Long Pond.

Ice fishing in Long pond regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to ice fishing, under the general law, Long pond in Somerville, Jefferson and Windsor.

Approved March 20, 1933

Chapter 75.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Ernest C. Brown, of Gorham.

Ernest C. Brown compensated for work done by father. Resolved: That the sum of \$351.78 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Ernest C. Brown, of Gorham, administrator of the estate of his father, L. W. Brown, deceased; this money to be paid from the Educational Normal School Fund.

Chapter 76.

RESOLVE, to Repeal a Resolve Providing for a State Pension for Nellie Buck.

Pension for Nellie Buck, discontinued. Resolved: That chapter 144 of the resolves of 1927, providing for a state pension for Nellie Buck, be, and hereby is, repealed.

Approved March 20, 1933
