Chapter 58.

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in the Office of the Clerk of Courts of Waldo County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 46, amended. The 15th paragraph of section 46 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Waldo county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$1560; for clerks in the office of register of probate, \$780; for clerks in the office of the clerk of courts, ~~\$700~~, \$800.'

Chapter 59.

AN ACT Relating to Temporary Loans by County Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 92, § 21, amended. Section 21 of chapter 92 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 21. County commissioners may provide for temporary loans. The county commissioners of Cumberland and Kennebec counties may, without obtaining the consent of their respective counties, raise, by temporary loan to be paid within 1 year from the time when the same is contracted out of money raised during the current year by taxes, sums not exceeding \$175,000 and \$50,000 respectively in any year for use of their respective counties and cause notes or obligations of their respective counties with coupons for lawful interest to be issued for payment thereof as aforesaid. The county commissioners of each and every other county may ~~under the same conditions~~ without obtaining the consent of their county raise by temporary loans to be paid within 1 year from the time when the same is contracted out of money raised during the current year by taxes not exceeding ~~one tenth~~ 1/5 of 1% of the assessed valuation of their respective counties.'
