CHAP. 10

who shall take alewives contrary to the provisions hereof, or who shall violate any provision of any rule and regulation duly made by said town to control the taking of alewives from said waters shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50 and costs of prosecution.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble hereof, this resolve shall take effect when approved:

Chapter 8.**RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Square Pond Tributaries.**

Fishing in tributaries of Square pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to fishing under the general law, the tributaries, wherever situated, to Square pond; said pond being in the towns of Acton and Shapleigh.

Chapter 9.**RESOLVE, in Favor of Georgie Bridges, of Verona.**

Georgie Bridges, of Verona, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$335, to be paid to Georgie Bridges, of Verona, as a settlement in full for all damages caused to her smelt nets by the state highway commission, "said sum to be paid from the general highway funds."

Chapter 10.**RESOLVE, in Favor of Herbert J. Hopkins, of Orland.**

Herbert J. Hopkins reimbursed for damages to property. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$50, to be paid to Herbert J. Hopkins, of Orland, in full settlement for all damage to his property caused by the building and raising of the state highway; "said sum to be paid from the general highway funds."
