Chapter 38.

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Tributaries to Walker's Pond.

Fishing in tributaries to Walker's pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the tributaries to Walker's pond, in Brooksville and Sedgwick, to all fishing excepting the taking of smelts under the present law.

Approved March 16, 1935.

Chapter 39.

RESOLVE, Closing to All Fishing Upper and Lower Hathan Bogs and Massachusetts Bog in Franklin County.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, an unusual condition has brought a large and unusual number of fishermen into close proximity to Upper and Lower Hathan bogs situated in Coburn Gore and Chain of Ponds township and also Massachusetts bog situated in Massachusetts Gore township, and

Whereas, the existing law does not afford sufficient legal protection to the fish therein, and

Whereas, if some conservation measures are not immediately enacted, the fishing in said waters will be ruined and the state will lose a great recreational and food asset, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Upper and Lower Hathan bogs and Massachusetts bog closed to all fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to all fishing for a period of 8 years Upper and Lower Hathan bogs situated in Coburn Gore and Chain of Ponds township and also Massachusetts bog situated in Massachusetts Gore township, all in Franklin county.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency recited in the preamble hereof, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
