Chapter 82.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Norris Wescott, of Prospect.

Norris Wescott; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$600 to be paid to Norris Wescott, of Prospect, to compensate him in full for injuries received while working for the state; said sum to be paid from the general highway fund.

Approved March 30, 1935.

Chapter 83.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Lang Plantation.

Lang plantation; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$500 to be paid to Lang plantation to reimburse said plantation for the sum of \$500, which was assessed in error to said plantation by the state of Maine and paid by said plantation to the state of Maine for mothers' aid in favor of one Mae Bachelder, said sum to be paid from the general state fund.

Approved March 30, 1935.

Chapter 84.

RESOLVE, Relating to the Dipping of Smelts in Mousam Lake in the Towns of Acton and Shapleigh.

Dipping of smelts in Mousam lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening the tributaries to Mousam lake, in the towns of Acton and Shapleigh, to the dipping of smelts with a daily limit of 2 quarts per person.

Approved March 30, 1935.

Chapter 85.

RESOLVE, Relative to Closing Armstrong Brook and Tributaries to Said Brook to All Fishing.

Fishing in Armstrong brook and tributaries to said brook, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to all fishing Armstrong brook and tributaries located in Stockholm, New Sweden, T. 16,
