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## Chapter 163

### AN ACT Making Mortgages Insured and Debentures Issued by the Federal Housing Administrator Eligible for Deposit Purposes.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Federal housing mortgages and debentures affected. Wherever collateral must or may be furnished by any depository in the state of Maine as security for the deposit of any funds whatsoever, or wherever collateral must or may be deposited with any official of the state of Maine pursuant to any statute of this state, mortgages insured and debentures issued by the Federal Housing Administrator shall be considered eligible collateral for such purposes.

Approved April 15, 1937.

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## Chapter 164

### AN ACT Relating to the Length of Motor Vehicles.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 29, § 54, amended. The 5th paragraph of subdivision c of section 54 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'And provided further that no motor vehicle, including trucks, combination of tractor and semi-trailer, passenger buses and passenger cars shall exceed in length ~~36~~ 40 feet over all and no trailer attached to a motor vehicle shall exceed in length 26 feet over all.'

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## Chapter 165

### AN ACT Relating to Temporary Permits for Motor Vehicle Contract Carriers.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

P. L., 1935, c. 146, § 5, additional. Section 5 of chapter 146 of the public laws of 1935 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new subsection to be numbered (E):
