CHAP. 50

aqueducts in any street, roadway or highway it shall cause the same to be done with as little obstruction as practicable to the public travel, and shall at its own expense, without unnecessary delay, cause the earth and pavement removed by it to be replaced in proper condition.'

Chapter 48**AN ACT Relating to North Yarmouth Academy.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Trustees of North Yarmouth Academy granted further powers. The trustees of North Yarmouth Academy are hereby granted the right and power of having, holding, and taking in fee simple, by gift, grant, devise or otherwise, any lands, tenements, or other estate, real or personal; provided however, that the annual income of the same shall not exceed \$15,000.

Chapter 49**AN ACT Validating Certain Acts of the Assessor of the Plantation of Caswell.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Tax assessment in Caswell validated. The assessment of taxes by the tax assessors of the plantation of Caswell for the year 1931 is hereby declared to be legal, valid and effective.

Chapter 50**AN ACT to Extend the Charter of the Vanceboro Water Company.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1931, c. 67, extended. The rights, powers and privileges granted by chapter 67 of the private and special laws of 1931 are hereby extended for a term of 2 years from the time when the same would otherwise expire.
