Chapter 40

RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of Pembroke.

Taking of clams in Pembroke, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Pembroke, shall take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from within the limits of the tidewaters of the town of Pembroke. Whoever violates any provision of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50, nor more than \$200.

Approved April 5, 1937.

Chapter 41

RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of Robbinston.

Taking of clams in Robbinston, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Robbinston, shall take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from within the limits of the tidewaters of the town of Robbinston. Whoever violates any provision of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50, nor more than \$200.

Chapter 42

RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams Within the Town of Dennysville.

Taking of clams in Dennysville, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation, except an inhabitant of the town of Dennysville, shall take more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams in any 1 day from within the limits of the tidewaters of the town of Dennysville. Whoever violates any provision of this resolve shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$100, nor more than \$200.

Approved April 5, 1937.
