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## Chapter 105

**RESOLVE**, in Favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow.

William A. Moran; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow, the sum of \$25.48 as a full and final settlement against the state, for damage to his camp No. 2 by bears; to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

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## Chapter 106

**RESOLVE**, in Favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow.

William A. Moran; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow, the sum of \$33.14 as a full and final settlement against the state, for damage to his camp No. 1 by bears; to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

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## Chapter 107

**RESOLVE**, in Favor of Hoyt F. Parks, of Clifton.

Hoyt F. Parks, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of Hoyt F. Parks, of Clifton, the sum of \$20 as a full and final settlement against the state for damage to his bees, hives and honey by bear; to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

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## Chapter 108

**RESOLVE**, in Favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow.

William A. Moran; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of William A. Moran, of Oxbow, the sum of \$26.30 as a full and final settlement against the state, for damage to his camp No. 4 by a bear; to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.
