Chapter 125

RESOLVE, in Favor of John Ruggles, of Carmel.

John Ruggles of Carmel; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$780.75 to be paid to John Ruggles, of Carmel to compensate him in full for all claims against the state for damages done to his filling station and store by Ralph Doucette, a paroled convict; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

Approved April 20, 1937.

Chapter 126

RESOLVE, in Favor of Enos G. Lambert, of Freeport.

Enos G. Lambert; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$3,000 to be paid to Enos G. Lambert, of Freeport, as a settlement in full for all damages caused to his buildings by arson committed by a paroled fire bug; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

Approved April 20, 1937.

Chapter 127

RESOLVE, in Favor of Charles E. Taylor, of Freeport.

Charles E. Taylor; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$5,000 to be paid to Charles E. Taylor, of Freeport, this amount to act as a settlement in full for all claims against the state, for damages caused to his buildings by arson committed by a paroled fire bug; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

Approved April 20, 1937.

Chapter 128

RESOLVE, Compensating a Bidder on the General Howard Memorial.

Victor Kahill; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$300 to be paid to Victor Kahill, of Portland, to compensate him in full for all claims against the state for expenses, labor and materials used in the making of a model for use in bidding on the General Howard Memorial; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.
