Chapter 64

RESOLVE, Relating to the Construction of a Dormitory at the Prison Farm.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, for reasons of economy and in order to properly guard the prisoners employed at the prison farm, it is necessary to construct a dormitory at the farm to accommodate about 75 inmates; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Construction of dormitory, authorized. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$20,000 for the construction of a secure dormitory at the prison farm to accommodate about 75 inmates; the construction to be done so far as practicable by prison labor and material.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency recited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
