Chapter 71

RESOLVE, Creating a Recess Committee on Motor Vehicle Legislation.

Recess committee on motor vehicle legislation, created. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, created a legislative recess committee to consist of I member of the senate and 2 members of the house of representatives to be appointed by the governor with the approval of the council. which committee shall be known as the Committee on Motor Vehicle Legis-Said committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by electing a chairman and secretary. Said committee shall consider and investigate the present laws of the state regulating the registration, insurance and operation of motor vehicles and the licensing of operators thereof, and the need of further additional enactments with especial reference to the safe operation of such motor vehicles and the protection of the public. Said committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the 90th legislature and, in the event that it finds it desirable that further legislation be enacted, or that present legislation should be codified, it shall draft a bill, or bills, for that purpose and have the same presented to the 90th legislature. The members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses incurred in the discharge of this duty, said expenses to be approved by the governor and council. Said expenses shall not exceed the sum of \$200.

Chapter 72

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money for Study and Control of the Fruit or Blueberry Fly in Maine.

Resolves 1925, c. 17, amended. Chapter 17 of the resolves of 1925 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Appropriation for blueberry fly control. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$5000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, and \$3000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941, to be expended under the direction of the commissioner of agriculture in repelling, destroying and mitigating the ravages of, and in preventing the spread and distribution of, the fruit fly infesting blueberries grown in the state of Maine, provided that any balance of the sum above appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, which may remain unexpended at the end of the said period shall be available for expenditure during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941, and that any unexpended balance at the end of June 30, 1941 lapse into the general fund.'
