Chapter 73

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Towns of Machiasport and East Machias.

Expenses of keeper of drawbridge cared for. Resolved: The expenses of paying the keeper of the drawbridge between the towns of Machiasport and East Machias shall be borne by the state and paid from the general highway fund. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or amended to conform herewith.

Chapter 74

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Grace E. Dunn of Portland.

Grace E. Dunn, state pension. Resolved: That Grace E. Dunn of Portland, a former employee of the State School for Boys at South Portland, for 20 years, is hereby made eligible to receive a retirement pension under the provisions of sections 227-230 of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933.

Chapter 75

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Artell Cookson, of Newcastle.

Artell Cookson; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$7 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Artell Cookson, of Newcastle, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents, to R. L. Hodgkins, of Newcastle, to be expended by him for the benefit of said Artell Cookson. The said Hodgkins shall make a quarterly accounting to the department of health and welfare. Said pension shall begin July 1, 1939, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.
