

Chapter 187

AN ACT to Amend the Unemployment Compensation Law with Respect to Advisory Councils.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 11, amended. Subsection (e) of section 11 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby repealed and the following subsection (e) enacted in place thereof:

'(e) Advisory councils. The commission may appoint a state advisory council consisting of not more than 6 members composed of an equal number of employer representatives and employee representatives who may fairly be regarded as representative because of their vocation, employment, or affiliations and an equal number of members representing the general public. Such councils shall aid the commission in formulating policies and discussing problems related to the administration of this act and in assuring impartiality and freedom from political influence in the solution of such problems. Each member of the advisory council shall be compensated in the amount of \$ro for each day in attendance upon a meeting of the council in addition to reimbursement for any necessary expenses, provided, however, that such compensation paid to any one member of the council shall not exceed the sum of \$60 in any one fiscal year.'

Chapter 188

AN ACT Amending the Unemployment Compensation Law so as to Permit Corrections of Benefit Claims.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new subsection (j) reading as follows:

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
