Chapter 140

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in Office of Register of Deeds in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. That part of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, which relates to clerk hire in the office of register of deeds in Kennebec county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$3,100, and such additional amount as may be authorized by the county commissioners;'

Chapter 141

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of Register of Deeds of Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 231, amended. That part of section 231 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the register of deeds of Kennebec county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Kennebec, \$2,000 \$2,200,'

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Liquor to be Consumed on the Premises.
