CHAP, 213

Chapter 211

AN ACT Relating to Hunting in Merrymeeting Bay.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 89, repealed. Section 89 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Effective July 21, 1945

Chapter 212

AN ACT to Increase the Amount to be Paid for Clerk Hire in the Office of Register of Deeds in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 269, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 269 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes, insofar as it relates to the annual amount to be paid for clerk hire in the office of register of deeds in Cumberland county, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$5,576 \$7,400; deputy register of deeds, \$7,400; deputy register of deeds, \$7,404 \$1,800;'

Chapter 213

AN ACT Relating to Yearly Fees for Boxers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 78, § 8, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 8 of chapter 78 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All persons engaging in such boxing contests as boxers, seconds, managers, referees, judges, and physicians must have been licensed by the commission in a like manner, such licenses to be subject to revocation or suspension for cause. The yearly fees shall be as follows: boxers, \$3 \$6; managers, \$5; seconds, \$2; referees, \$5; judges and physicians, no fee.'
