CHAP. 365

Chapter 363

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Adjutant-General.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 12, § 12, amended. The 9th paragraph of section 12 of chapter 12 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The adjutant-general shall receive an annual salary of \$4,500 \$5,500; he shall receive no other fee, emolument, or perquisite. The provisions of this act shall remain in effect for the period of 2 years, after which period the present statute shall return to full force and effect.'

Chapter 364

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Commissioner of Agriculture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 27, § 1, amended. The 3rd sentence of section 1 of chapter 27 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'He shall receive an annual salary of \$4,500 \$6,000.'

Chapter 365

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Bank Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 55, § 1, amended. The last sentence of the 1st paragraph of section 1 of chapter 55 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'He shall receive an annual salary of \$5,000 \$6,000, and his actual traveling expenses incurred in the performance of his duties.'
