#### Chapter 26

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Maine Historical Society.

Maine historical society; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the Maine historical society the sum of \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1946; and the sum of \$2,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947; the same to be paid in quarterly payments commencing on October 1, 1945.

#### Chapter 27

RESOLVE, in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier".

Knox Memorial Association, Inc.; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1946, and the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1947, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier", replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine.

### Chapter 28

RESOLVE, in Favor of Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Penobscot Tribe of Indians; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,000 from the general fund of the state to be paid to the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the purpose of constructing a receiving vault for the dead; and be it further

**Resolved:** That such construction be under the direction and supervision of the department of health and welfare.
