Chapter 66

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Estate of R. Byron Flewelling, Late of West Gardiner, Deceased; for Loss of Life.

Estate of R. Byron Flewelling, deceased; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1,500 to be paid to Adaline B. Flewelling, of Gardiner, as administratrix of the estate of R. Byron Flewelling, late of West Gardiner, deceased, as a full and final settlement against the state, for the death of said R. Byron Flewelling, who was burned to death in a fire in a barn located on his farm in said West Gardiner, which fire was set by Elgra O. Ryder of Clinton, a minor ward of the state; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

Chapter 67

RESOLVE, in Favor of Charles B. Buck, of Newfield.

Charles B. Buck; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$245 to be paid Charles B. Buck, of Newfield, for 245 pullets valued at \$1 each, killed by foxes; said sum to be paid from the dog tax fund.

Chapter 68

RESOLVE, Granting Additional Pension for Burtis F. Fowler, of Augusta.

Burtis F. Fowler; additional pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$3.50 per week be, and hereby is, granted to Burtis F. Fowler, of Augusta, to be paid monthly from the general fund of the state. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1945 and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.
