Chapter 66

AN ACT Relating to System of Records and Accounting by Maine Teachers' Retirement Board.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 226, amended. The next to the last sentence of section 226 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows: 'Said board shall establish and maintain a complete system of records and accounting in accordance with the provisions of subsection VII of section 16 of chapter 14.'

Chapter 67

AN ACT Validating Certain Divorces.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 153, § 57-A, additional. Chapter 153 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 57-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 57-A. Certain divorces validated. All divorces heretofore granted in this state on libels inserted in a writ of attachment, and otherwise valid except for want of attachment nominal or otherwise upon the writ, are hereby validated.'

Chapter 68

AN ACT Relating to Duties of the Deputy Treasurer of State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 15, § 1, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 1 of chapter 15 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The chief clerk in the office of the treasurer of state shall be designated as "Deputy Treasurer of State." In the event of a vacancy in the office of treasurer of state or during the absence or disability of that officer, the deputy treasurer of state shall perform the duties of the office. When a vacancy occurs, he shall give bond to the state, with sureties, to the satisfaction of the governor and council, for the faithful discharge of his trust.'
