Chapter 72

AN ACT Relating to Validity of Signature of Outgoing State Controller.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 14, § 16-A, additional. Chapter 14 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 16-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 16-A. Signature of outgoing state controller valid. The facsimile signature of the state controller who is leaving office shall be valid until new signature plates for the signing of checks have been obtained for his successor.'

Chapter 73

AN ACT Relating to Liens on Articles of Clothing and Household or Office Goods.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 164, amended. Chapter 164 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 70-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 70-A. Lien on clothing and household goods. Every individual, partnership, or corporation, having an established place of business in this state, engaged in cleaning, pressing, washing, dyeing or performing similar work on articles of clothing or household or office goods, or, with or without furnishing materials or supplies, in making alterations or repairs thereon, or in placing any of such articles in storage at the request of the owner thereof, for a price, shall have a lien upon said articles of clothing or household and office goods for a reasonable compensation for said labor, materials or storage to which lien all the provisions set forth in the 3 preceding sections shall be applicable in full.'
