Chapter 122

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the County Attorney of Hancock County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the county attorney of Hancock county is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Hancock, ~~\$1,200~~ \$1,800,'

Chapter 123

AN ACT Relating to the Issuance of Dealer's Registration.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 19, amended. Section 19 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph, to read as follows:

'Provided, however, that the secretary of state shall not issue such registration until the applicant shall have procured and filed with said secretary of state insurance insuring said applicant against any legal liability for personal injury or death of any 1 person in the sum of \$10,000 and for any number of persons in the sum of \$20,000 and against property damage in the sum of \$5,000, which injury, death or damage may result from or have been caused by the operation of any motor vehicle bearing such dealer's registration. In lieu of such insurance, the applicant may file with said secretary of state a bond or bonds issued by a surety company authorized to do business in the state guaranteeing the payment of any judgment secured against such applicant on account of any such injuries, damage or death.'

Chapter 124

AN ACT Relating to State Aid to Certain Educational Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 106, sub-§ II, amended. The last sentence of subsection II of section 106 of chapter 37 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
