Chapter 23

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Hatchery Brook in the Town of Belgrade, Kennebec County.

Fishing in Hatchery brook, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Hatchery brook, from Salmon Lake to Great Pond, in the town of Belgrade, Kennebec county, to all fishing from the time the ice goes out in the spring to June 1.

Chapter 24

RESOLVE, Establishing the Opening Date for Open Water Fishing in Sabbathday Lake in Cumberland County.

Establishing the opening date for open water fishing in Sabbathday lake in Cumberland county. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing the opening date for open water fishing in Sabbathday lake in the town of New Gloucester in the county of Cumberland to be May 1st.

Chapter 25

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Jerry Pond.

Fishing in Jerry Pond; regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Jerry Pond in Township 5, Range 7, Penobscot county, to ice fishing.
