Chapter 42

RESOLVE, Opening Cushman Pond in the Town of Sumner to Ice Fishing.

Cushman pond opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Cushman pond in the town of Sumner, Oxford county, to ice fishing.

Chapter 43

RESOLVE, in Favor of Teacher-Pension Status of Martha O. Crosby of Benton.

Martha O. Crosby; pension for. Resolved: That Martha O. Crosby of Benton be given full credit for 3 years' service as a local superintendent of schools in the town of Benton, thus entitling her to a teacher's pension based on 25 years of service, which provides a \$400 annual pension.

Chapter 44

RESOLVE, Providing for a Fish Screen at Outlet of Molasses Pond in the Town of Eastbrook.

Outlet of Molasses pond; screening of. Resolved: That the sum of \$400 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the legislative appropriation for the department of inland fisheries and game, for installing a fish screen at the outlet of Molasses pond in the town of Eastbrook in the county of Hancock; provided, however, that the property owners on this pond restore the dam, and that said screen shall not be installed at the outlet of Molasses pond until the town of Eastbrook shall assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same.
