RESOLVES, 1947**CHAP. 100**

report the results of their study at the next regular session of the legislature; and be it further

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated whatever sums are necessary, not to exceed \$500, to carry out the provisions of this resolve; and be it further

Resolved: That the expenses incurred under the provisions of this resolve shall be paid currently from the Indian accounts.

RESOLVE, Opening Pleasant Lake, in Washington County, to Ice Fishing.

Pleasant lake; opened to ice fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Pleasant lake, T. 6, R. 1 - T. 7, R. 2, Washington county, to ice fishing for all fish, except bass, during February on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, only.

Chapter 99

RESOLVE, Closing the Tributaries to Wassookeag Lake in Dexter in Penobscot County to All Fishing.

Closing the tributaries to Wassookeag lake in Dexter in Penobscot county to all fishing. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the tributaries to Wassookeag lake in Dexter in the county of Penobscot to all fishing.

Chapter 100

RESOLVE, Regulating Dipping of Smelts in Lake Cobbosseecontee.

Lake Cobbosseecontee closed to smelt dipping. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close lake Cobbosseecontee in the county of Kennebec to the taking of smelts by dip-nets.
