Chapter 109

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Repair Fish Screen at Meduxnekeag Lake.

Fish screen at Meduxnekeag lake; repair of. Resolved: That the sum of \$500 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be taken from the general fund of the state for the purpose of repairing the fish screen at the outlet of Meduxnekeag lake, in the county of Aroostook; said fund to be expended under the direction of the commissioner of inland fisheries and game.

Chapter 110

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Mary E. Dunbar, of Portland.

Mary E. Dunbar; teacher's pension. Resolved: That a special pension be, and hereby is, granted to Mary E. Dunbar, of Portland, comparable with that paid under the teachers' noncontributory pension law, based on 25 years of teaching service, as is now or may hereafter be provided by the legislature, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for pensions for retired teachers. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1947 and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 111

RESOLVE, in Favor of Alfred Winick of Boston, Massachusetts.

Alfred Winick; reimbursed. Resolved: That the county commissioners of the county of Cumberland be, and hereby are, authorized to pay to Alfred Winick of Boston, Massachusetts, the sum of \$3,000 in repayment of money paid by Alfred Winick to said county in the forfeiture of bail for Mary Altone at the January term of 1943 of the superior court within and for the county of Cumberland.
