## Chapter 118

### RESOLVE, Closing Saddleback Stream to All Fishing.

Closing Saddleback stream to all fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Saddleback stream from the Rangeley Water Company dam to its junction with the outlets of Midway and Eddy ponds and all tributaries between these 2 points to all fishing.

## Chapter 119

### RESOLVE, Sale of Hatcheries and Feeding Stations Property Authorized.

Sale of hatcheries and feeding stations property authorized. Resolved: That the state tax assessor is hereby authorized to sell to the highest bidder, for the department of inland fisheries and game, the following hatchery and feeding station property:

Camden hatchery buildings at a minimum price of \$4,500.

Monmouth hatchery buildings and approximately 35 acres of land at a minimum price of \$5,500.

Belgrade hatchery buildings and 15 acres of land more or less at a minimum price of \$5,500.

Houlton feeding station buildings and 3 acres of land more or less at a minimum price of \$2,200.

Hollis feeding station buildings and 2  $\frac{3}{10}$  acres of land at a minimum price of \$1,500.

Jackman feeding station buildings at a minimum price of \$500.

Cherryfield feeding station buildings at a minimum price of \$800.

Norridgewock feeding station buildings and 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  acres of land more or less at a minimum price of \$1,500.

All moneys received shall be paid into a fund to be used by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game for the construction of new hatcheries or feeding stations.
