RESOLVE, in Favor of George P. Milne and Jesse B. Lewis, both of Hallowell.

Lewis, both of Hallowell, for reimbursement for expenses incurred in printing and distributing a book known as "History of Maine's Civilian Defense Corps."

RESOLVE, in Favor of Arthur H. Ashmore, of Camden.

Arthur H. Ashmore; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the state police appropriation the sum of \$224 to be paid to Arthur H. Ashmore, of Camden, as a full and final settlement of his claim against the state for injuries received in a motorcycle accident while on duty as a member of the state police.
