Chapter 121

AN ACT Relating to Lobster and Crab Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 115, amended. The 5th paragraph of section 115 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 122

AN ACT Relating to Commercial Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 34, § 50, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 50 of chapter 34 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'No person shall take, catch or kill for commercial purposes any species of fish, except smelts by hook and line, in the coastal waters of the state until he has procured from the commissioner a written license therefor.'

Chapter 123

AN ACT Relative to Hunting and Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 64, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 64 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'The commissioner shall revoke the license, for 1 year from the date of conviction, issued to a person to carry on the particular activity in which he was engaged at the time of the violation of sections 13, ~~47~~, ~~48~~, 61, 62, 66, 67, 68, 69, 71, 80, 81, 82, 83, 85, 89, ~~99~~, 105 and 106.'
