## Chapter 337

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the County Attorney of Waldo County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 of the revised statutes which relates to the salary of the county attorney of Waldo county, as amended by section 2 of chapter 322 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Waldo, ~~\$1,300~~ \$1,500.'

## Chapter 338

AN ACT to Increase the Salary of the County Attorney of Knox County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

R. S., c. 79, § 130, amended. That part of section 130 of chapter 79 which relates to the salary of the county attorney of Knox county, as amended by chapter 178 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Knox, ~~\$1,200~~ \$1,500.'
