#### Chapter 126

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Clams, Quahogs, Mussels and Worms in the Town of Islesboro.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of clams, quahogs, mussels and worms in the town of Islesboro. It shall be unlawful for any person to dig any clams, quahogs, mussels or worms within the limits of the town of Islesboro, in the county of Waldo, except a resident of said town. Provided further, that no such resident shall dig more than 1/2 bushel of clams, quahogs or mussels in any I day within said town, without first having procured therefor a written license, which the selectmen are hereby authorized to issue upon payment of a fee of \$2. Licenses issued under authority hereof shall expire at midnight of December 31st of the calendar year in which they were issued. Nothing herein shall prohibit hotel keepers from taking clams, quahogs or mussels for the use of their hotels nor fishermen from taking shellfish for bait nor any person from digging not in excess of 1/2 bushel in any I day for his own use nor any riparian owner from digging on his own property.

For the purposes of this chapter, the term "a resident" shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months and in the town of Islesboro for at least 3 months immediately prior to the date when a claim of such residence is made.

Whoever digs clams, quahogs, mussels or worms in violation of the preceding provisions shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

#### Chapter 127

AN ACT Relating to the Salaries of the Judge and the Clerk of the Auburn Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1915, c. 194, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 194 of the private and special laws of 1915, as amended by section 1 of chapter **CHAP. 128**

144 of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. I. Auburn municipal court established; appointment and salary of judge. A municipal court is hereby established in and for the city of Auburn, to be denominated the municipal court of the city of Auburn, which shall be a court of record and have a clerk and a seal, and consist of I judge, appointed as provided in the constitution, who shall be a citizen of Auburn and a member of the bar of the county of Androscoggin, and who shall be, ex officio, a justice of the peace and of the quorum, and have and exercise concurrent authority and jurisdiction with trial justices over all matters and things by law within their jurisdiction, and such authority and jurisdiction additional thereto as is conferred upon him by this act, and who shall receive from said city an annual salary of \$2,100 \$2,400 to be paid to him in monthly payments.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1915, c. 194, § 4, amended. The last sentence of section 4 of chapter 194 of the private and special laws of 1915, as amended by section 2 of chapter 144 of the private and special laws of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Said clerk shall receive from said city an annual salary of \$1,500 and an annual allowance of \$600 for clerk hire, to be paid to him in monthly payments.'

#### Chapter 128

AN ACT to Create the Mount Desert Island Secondary Community School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Territorial limits; name; purposes. Subject to the provisions of this act, the inhabitants of and the territory within the towns of Bar Harbor, Mount Desert, Tremont and Southwest Harbor, in the county of Hancock, or any 2 or more of said towns, are hereby created a secondary community school district under the name of "Mount Desert Island Secondary Community School District" for the purpose of acquiring property within said district for school and related athletic and recreational purposes; for the purpose of erecting, enlarging, repairing, equipping and maintaining on said property a school building or buildings and related athletic and recreational facilities; for the purpose of receiving, accepting
