**CHAP. 146** 

PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1949

only for school purposes and shall be kept separate from all other money until authorized by the municipal officers of the town of Masardis to be expended as hereinbefore stated.

Sec. 8. Effective date; referendum. This act shall take effect 90 days after the adjournment of this legislature only for the purpose of permitting its submission to the legal voters of the territory embraced within the limits of said district, present and voting at any annual or special town meeting called and held for that purpose not later than I year after the effective date of this act. Such special meeting shall be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections; provided, however, that the board of registration of said town shall not be required to prepare for posting, or the town clerk to post, a new list of voters, and for the purpose of registration of voters, said board shall be in session I hour preceding such election. The town clerk shall prepare the required ballots upon which he shall reduce the subject matter of this act to the following question: "Shall the act to incorporate the town of Masardis School District be accepted?" and the voters shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed over the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same. The result of the vote in said district shall be declared by the municipal officers of the town of Masardis and a certificate thereof filed by the town clerk with the secretary of state. This act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at such meeting; provided that the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this act at said meeting equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all candidates for governor in said town at the next previous gubernatorial election.

#### Chapter 146

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge of the South Portland Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1895, c. 242, § 23, Item VIII, amended. The 1st sentence of Item VIII of section 23 of chapter 242 of the private and special laws of 1895, as amended by chapter 34 of the private and special laws of 1943, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'The judge of said court shall receive a salary of \$1,500 \$2,000 per year from the 1st day of January, 1943, to be paid him in quarterly payments

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from the county treasury of Cumberland county which shall be in full for the services as such judge.'

#### Chapter 147

AN ACT to Create the Town of Orland School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Incorporation; name; purposes. Subject to the provisions of sections 7 and 9 hereof, the inhabitants of and the territory within the town of Orland are hereby created a body politic and corporate under the name of "Town of Orland School District" for the purpose of acquiring property within the said town for school and related athletic and recreational purposes; for the purpose of erecting, enlarging, repairing, equipping and maintaining on said property a school building or school buildings and related athletic and recreational facilities; for the purpose of completing, grading, furnishing, rebuilding, renovating and otherwise bettering the condition of any or all buildings within said town used for school purposes or which may hereafter be used for school purposes; for the purpose of leasing or letting any property of said district to said town; for the purpose of receiving, accepting and holding gifts, grants or devises of property real, personal or mixed to be used for school and related athletic and recreational purposes; all for the benefit of the inhabitants of said district.
- Sec. 2. Trustees, powers and duties; limitations. All the affairs of said district (except election of teachers who shall serve in the said schools and the fixing of their salaries, the course of study, the terms of school and all other matters pertaining to the education of pupils, which matters shall be controlled by the school board of the town of Orland) shall be managed by a board of 5 trustees who shall be residents of the town of Orland and who shall be elected as hereinafter provided. The board of trustees, acting for said district, shall have and exercise all the powers and authority necessary to carry out the purposes of this act and the powers and authority granted herein.
- Sec. 3. Trustees; how elected, tenure of office, organization of board; officers, vacancies; compensation; reports. As soon as may be after the acceptance of this act, as hereinafter provided, the municipal officers of the town of Orland shall appoint 5 trustees of said district, to hold office as follows respectively: I until the next annual municipal election following ac-
