1082 SALARY OF THE JUDGE OF THE LEWISTON MUNICIPAL COURT CHAP. 190 PRIVATE AND SPECIAL, 1949

said ballot shall be in form provided by law when a constitutional amendment is submitted to the vote of the people.

If a majority of the qualified voters of the city, present and voting, vote in favor of the acceptance of this act, it shall become operative. The city clerk shall forthwith file with the secretary of state a certificate of the action of the voters thereon.

Chapter 189

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Clerk and Clerk Hire of the Lewiston Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1921, c. 128, § 1, amended. The 1st sentence of section 1 of chapter 128 of the private and special laws of 1921, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"The clerk of the municipal court for the city of Lewiston shall receive an annual salary of \$2,700 \$2,300, with \$7,800 \$2,000 additional for clerk hire from said city in monthly payments, which sum shall be in full compensation for the performance of all duties required of said clerk by law.'

Chapter 190

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Judge of the Lewiston Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- P. & S. L., 1871, c. 636, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 636 of the private and special laws of 1871, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 1. Municipal court established; salary of judge. A municipal court is hereby established for the city of Lewiston, which shall be a court of record, and have a seal, and shall consist of one 1 judge, who shall be a member of the bar in Androscoggin county, who shall be appointed, elected,

qualified and hold his office as provided in the constitution, who shall reside during his continuance in office in said city of Lewiston, and who shall receive from said city in monthly payments an annual salary of \$2,500 \$2,700, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining to his office.'

Chapter 191

AN ACT to Incorporate the Town of Lubec School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Incorporation; name; purposes. The inhabitants of the town of Lubec and the territory within said town, subject to the provisions of this act, are hereby created a body politic and corporate under the name of "Town of Lubec School District", for the purposes of acquiring property within the said town for school and related athletic and recreational purposes; for the purpose of erecting, enlarging, repairing, equipping and maintaining on said property a school building or school buildings and related athletic and recreational facilities; for the purpose of maintaining elementary and secondary schools; for the purpose of completing, grading, furnishing, rebuilding, renovating and otherwise bettering the condition of any or all buildings within said town used for school purposes or which may hereafter be used for school buildings; for the purpose of leasing or letting any property of said district to said town; for the purpose of receiving and holding gifts, grants or devises of property, real, personal or mixed, to be used for school and related athletic and recreational purposes; all for the benefit of the inhabitants of said district.
- Sec. 2. Trustees; powers and duties; limitations. All the affairs of said district, (except election of teachers who shall serve in the said schools and fixing of their salaries, the courses of study, the terms of school and all other matters pertaining to the education of pupils, which matters shall be controlled by the school board of the town of Lubec), shall be managed by a board of 5 trustees, who shall be elected as is hereinafter provided. The board of trustees, acting for said district, shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities necessary to carry out the purposes of this act and the powers and authorities granted herein.

The trustees of said district shall submit to the legal voters within said district, at a meeting called and notice given in the same manner as special meetings of the towns are required to be notified and held by the laws of
