Chapter 6

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Forest Lake in the Town of Friendship, Knox County.

Fishing in Forest lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of 5 fish per person per day of a minimum length of 8 inches from Forest lake, town of Friendship, Knox county.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 7

RESOLVE, Closing Salt Pond in the Towns of Friendship and Cushing to Ice Fishing.

Salt pond closed to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to close Salt pond in the towns of Friendship and Cushing, Knox county, to ice fishing.

Effective August 6, 1949

Chapter 8

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Smelt Brook in the County of Washington.

Regulating fishing in Smelt brook in the county of Washington. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Smelt brook in the town of Marshfield, in the county of Washington, to all fishing.

Chapter 9

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Colcord Pond in the County of Oxford.

Regulating fishing in Colcord pond in the county of Oxford. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Colcord pond in the town of Porter in the county of Oxford and its tributaries to the dipping of smelts.
