CHAP. 23

Whereas, great hardship will be caused among the employees unless such salary scale is maintained, and suitable replacements could not be found; and

Whereas, the efficiency of the administration of state affairs in all departments is vitally affected; and

Whereas, efficient administration is vital to the well-being of the state and to its citizens; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Present salary scale for state employees, maintained. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$110,000 from the general fund of the state for the purpose of defraying the cost of the temporary salary increase for state employees, as already authorized by the personnel board, for the remainder of the present fiscal year.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall become effective March 5, 1949.

Chapter 22

RESOLVE, Extending the Open Season on Gull Pond.

Open season on Gull pond extended. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation to open Gull pond, situated in Dallas plantation, county of Franklin, to fly fishing only, with a daily bag limit of I fish, from the 1st day of October to the 15th day of the same month.
