Chapter 42

RESOLVE in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc. for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier".

Knox Memorial Association, Inc.; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1950, and the sum of \$1,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1951, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier", replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine.

RESOLVE Regulating Fishing in McGrath and Ellis Ponds, in the County of Kennebec.

Regulating fishing in McGrath and Ellis ponds, in the county of Kennebec. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing McGrath and Ellis ponds, in the towns of Oakland and Belgrade, in the county of Kennebec, to fishing for white perch until June 21 of each year.

RESOLVE Closing East Pond Stream to All Fishing.

Closing East Pond stream to all fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation closing East Pond stream from North pond to the Wyman Dam, so called, in the town of Smithfield, county of Somerset, to all fishing.
